- 23 Alexandria Area High School graduates and current students have been named 2022 AP Scholars based on their performance on Advanced Placement (AP) exams.
- 121 students, about 60% Alexandria Public Schools students, had the opportunity to participate in the Summer Challenge Academy, a one-week, intense class offered in the summer for students in gifted high ability programs.
- 192 professional certifications obtained by Alexandria Area High School students.
- 106 students received their Ford Automotive Career Exploration (ACE) safety certification.
- 24 students obtained their CNA (Certified Nurse Assistant) certification through AAHS coursework.
- 29 students in the high school Emergency Medical Responder course were successfully certified as EMR's.
- 33 CAPS Healthcare students received their CPR/First Aid certification.

## AAHS Ag Program plants Kernza grain test plot

AAHS is one of the first high schools in MN to grow Kernza with guidance from the U of M. Kernza is a perennial grain related to wheat that has multiple uses including being beneficial to water quality and the environment. The school's agricultural program is helping students learn more about the versatile grain by having them plant a two-acre test plot. Alexandria School Board member Alan Zeithmaer brought up the idea of Kernza research. "We have always been looking for opportunities to find partnerships that are more authentic and real world," Zeithamer said. On November 5, 2019, voters approved a phased-in operating levy providing additional funding to bridge our budget gap and help maintain our excellent academic programs, student support services and class sizes.

## Here's an update on our referendum commitment to Expanding Mental Health Support:

- Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) has a part-time social worker that works with staff and families.
- Each of the GMC Schools (Garfield, Miltona, Carlos) has a full-time social worker with a few additional district responsibilities (Coaching teachers in Teacher-Child Interaction Training - TCIT). In addition, the district works with the Village Family Service Center for co-located mental health services as needed.
- Woodland Elementary currently has 3 social workers (1.0 in special education, 2.0 in general education/intervention) and 2 board-certified behavior support (BCBA) specialists - one intervention and one in special education. In addition, students are serviced through co-location with the Village on site.
- Voyager Elementary currently has 1 social worker and 1 board-certified behavior support (BCBA) specialist split between special education/intervention/general education. In addition, students are serviced through co-location with the Village on site.
- Lincoln Elementary currently has 2 social workers (split between special education/intervention/general education). In addition, students are serviced through co-location with the Village on site.

- Discovery Middle School (DMS) currently has 2 social workers one works with students in special education and the other in
  general/intervention. There are 2 deans/counselors working with
  students in the building. Additional support is provided by 2 boardcertified behavior support (BCBA) specialists one intervention and
  one in special education. In addition, students are serviced through
  co-location with Lakeland Mental Health on-site.
- Alexandria Area High School (AAHS) currently has 2.5 social workers who split their time between special education/ attendance/ intervention and general education. Four counselors work at AAHS, providing guidance to students in 9th grade and through each Academy. AAHS has one Dean at the ninth-grade level. In addition, students are serviced through co-location with Lakeland Mental Health on-site.
- Additionally, the district has one social worker that collaborates with each building, manages Alternative Delivery Specialized Instructional Services (ADSIS), and provides coaching district-wide.



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
