



Principal's Message

Greetings, Parents,

In September's newsletter, I shared that one of our main goals for the year is to grow as reading teachers by implementing our new Benchmark Advance 2022 reading curriculum. Here is a "midseason" update.

Benchmark Advance is centered on the science of structured reading. Early reviews from teachers have been overwhelmingly positive, with reports that the new curriculum has a wealth of wonderful resources and is much more user-friendly than past

literacy approaches. Also, Benchmark Advance is more rigorous in terms of what students are asked to do, but they have answered the call by producing amazing work. There is typically a dip in scores with the first-year implementation of curriculum, but I am happy to report that our winter STAR scores are robust and do not show a decline.

While most are pleased with Benchmark and the learning we are seeing from students, I want to acknowledge the extra effort that teachers and literacy coaches have put in to learn and teach something new. This is no small task, and our teachers deserve recognition for logging extra time daily to polish each lesson. Parents, if you get a chance, thank your child's teacher for their dedication to this special project.

I am curious to hear about the parent experience with Benchmark. Do you have feedback on the Home-School Connection letters that are sent home at the beginning of each unit? Does your child talk about literacy work in the classroom? If you have any input, feel free to share it with me or with your child's teacher. The upcoming conferences in March would be a good opportunity to do so.
